EDITORIAL PROCEDURE

Radical Philosophy is run by an Editorial Collective with about twenty members, who work on an entirely voluntary basis and without any outside support.

The journal appears three times a year. The editorial process is co-ordinated by an Editorial Group with three members, drawn by rotation from the Editorial Collective. Each member of the Editorial Group serves for one year, with one member being replaced as each issue of the magazine is finalised. The senior member of the Editorial Group serves as Issue Editor for one issue. The Issue Editor is responsible for seeing that each article submitted is read and refereed by the Editorial Group plus three other members of the Editorial Collective, one of whom is appointed Article Editor and thus takes responsibility for communication with the author.

Reviews are processed separately. The Reviews Editor is responsible for commissioning reviews and for relations with publishers.

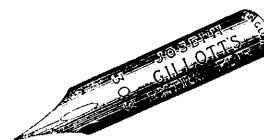
The full Editorial Collective considers the recommendations of the Editorial Group and the Reviews Editor and takes final editorial decisions.
